DANIEL DYER


Daniel's favorite quote is from Shakespeare's "Sonnet 116": ***"Let me not to the marriage of true minds / Admit impediments."*** Daniel's advice for the younger generation: **READ!!!!!!**

Daniel Dyer was born on November 11, 1944 in Enid, Oklahoma, the middle child of three children: younger brother, Dave, and older brother, Richard. He moved to Hiram, Ohio in 1956 when his father became a professor of education at Hiram College. Daniel fondly remembers the times he played baseball and tennis throughout his youth. While an undergraduate at the college where his father taught, he worked at on-campus jobs in the kitchen and the library.

After completing his bachelor's degree, he began taking graduate courses at Kent State University, where he met the love of his life, Joyce, in an American Transcendentalism class. They met in July of 1969 and tied the knot on December 20, 1969—driving to New Orleans for their honeymoon in a snowstorm. They settled down in Kent, where they started a family and finished their PhDs. For a year they moved to Illinois and taught at Lake Forest College, near Chicago, but they came back to Ohio, where Daniel proceeded to complete thirty years of teaching at Harmon Middle School in Aurora and ten more years at Western Reserve Academy in Hudson, Ohio. He was named one of the year's fifty "Most Interesting People" in the Cleveland area by "Cleveland Magazine" in 1994, awarded an excellence in teaching prize from Western Reserve Academy in 2011, and inducted into the Aurora Alumni Association Honored Educator Hall of Fame in 2013.

Daniel loves Shakespeare and has read all his plays and taught many of them to his students. He has seen live performances of every play. A prolific reader and writer, Daniel reviewed hundreds of books for "Kirkus Reviews" and the "Cleveland Plain Dealer" and has written several memoirs, collections of poetry, and biographies of Jack London, Mary Shelley, Edgar Allan Poe, John O'Hara, and William Shakespeare. His annotated and illustrated edition of "The Call of the Wild" has become a standard reference.

He cherishes memories of having taught his son, Stephen, at Harmon Middle School and of their daily drives together, as well as a trip he took with Steve to Alaska when he was completing his "Call of the Wild" research. Steve recently took his younger son to Alaska to retrace the trip he had made with his father. On an earlier trip, Steve and his older son found many places in Oklahoma that held meaning for Daniel—his elementary school (Adams), his house on Elm Street, his grandmother's house. Steve's son took a loaf of bread along with him and threw a piece of it everywhere they visited to show Daniel how much he is loved. You all might be wondering, Why a loaf of bread? Well, Daniel is an amazing sourdough baker—and has been for 35 years! He loves to bake and so his grandson took a loaf of bread that Daniel had made and scattered it on the Oklahoma ground where his grandfather had stood when he was a boy.




Beartown Lakes Reservation

Sept. 22 – The first official day of Fall! Get ready for apples, cooler weather, and everything pumpkin


